The Small Block Series reflects the next generation's pursuit of state-of-the-art innovations in the winery, and their desire to express the personalities of Napa Valley and Sonoma Valley grapes in the bottle.

#### **RESILIENCE IN THE VINEYARD**

Vintage 2023 is characterized as one of the longest growing seasons in a decade. The mild weather lead to above-average crop yields. With all of the heavy winter rains the reservoirs were full for ideal conditions and saturated soil. The winter rains gave the vines much needed hydration as they woke up from their dormant winter, and because of the cooler vintage this will be bright and clean.

#### FROM THE CELLAR

"This is a Provençal inspired Rosé, light pink in color with aromas of pink grapefruit, Alpine strawberry and hints of minerality. The palate has a refreshing acidity that is enhanced by delicious flavors of Alpine strawberry and Ruby Red grapefruit that lead to a cheerful and clean finish. This is an elegant, light-weight wine best enjoyed on a warm day in the company of good friends."
